



POLICY FOR REPRODUCING, OR TRANSLATING AND REPRODUCING, PUBLICATIONS ISSUED BY THE INTERNATIONAL VALUATION STANDARDS COUNCIL

JUNE 2011

Introduction

1. A primary objective of the International Valuation Standards Council (IVSC) is to develop a single set of high-quality International Valuation Standards (IVS), technical guidance to assist in the consistent and rigorous application of the Standards, and other publications that enable valuers worldwide to provide services of consistently high quality and in the public interest. In this Policy Statement, all are referred to collectively as “IVSC publications”.
2. IVSC remains committed to the long-term goal of the global adoption, in their entirety and without modification, of the IVS as developed by IVSC and the supporting technical guidance. IVSC recognises that countries – through national valuation institutes, national standard setters, regulatory authorities, or government - will establish their own mechanisms for the adoption of the IVS. IVSC also recognises that many areas of valuation activity will continue to be influenced by national legislation and that there may be a continuing need for guidance to be developed at the national level to meet these specific national requirements. To achieve the goal of global adoption, IVSC encourages the convergence of valuation standards and guidance issued by others to those issued by the IVSC. To assist in convergence, IVSC grants permission to reproduce IVSC publications or extracts from those publications when the party seeking permission, and the use of IVSC publications, are considered appropriate.
3. IVSC also encourages translations of its publications. IVSC currently does not have the resources to undertake a central translation activity. It is therefore left to the discretion of IVSC members, national standard setters, regulators or others to arrange for translations. IVSC will maintain a database of translations of IVSC publications provided by third parties that it will publish on the IVSC website.



4. IVSC recognises that a single translation of its publications would reduce confusion as to the source and availability the publications and eliminate differences in terminology that may exist in multiple translations. IVSC will encourage translating bodies to collaborate with other interested parties that may benefit from using the IVSC publications in the language of translation in order or achieve a single quality translation of the publication in that language.
5. This policy statement applies when an IVSC member, standard setter, regulator or another party (for purposes of this policy statement referred to as an “interested party”) reproduces, or translates and reproduces, any of the final IVSC publications, exposure drafts of proposed IVSC publications, or discussion papers issued by the IVSC. It applies to the reproduction, or translation and reproduction, of the full text of or extracts from an IVSC publication; and in circumstances where an IVSC publication is used as the basis for another publication.

Request for permission to reproduce, or translate and reproduce, an IVSC publication

6. Any party wishing to reproduce, or translate and reproduce, the full text or extracts from an IVSC publication should first submit a written Permission Request to mtissier@ivsc.org using the form as attached at Appendix A. If the request is accepted by IVSC, a written agreement will be drafted describing the conditions surrounding the permitted uses of the publication that must be signed by both parties. IVSC will only enter into such an arrangement with a reputable interested party, and where IVSC considers the intended reproduction, or translation and reproduction of the final IVSC publication appropriate.
7. In general, IVSC will only enter into a non-exclusive agreement with an interested party and will not grant an organisation the exclusive rights to reproduce, or translate and reproduce an IVSC publication.
8. IVSC alone will hold the copyright to any version of its works, whether in the English language or translated into another language.
9. Interested parties who receive permission to reproduce, or translate and reproduce, the full text of or extracts from an IVSC publication will be required to publish a copyright statement provided by IVSC.



10. As a principle, permission to reproduce, or translate and reproduce, the full text of or extracts from an IVSC publication does not carry with it the right to the use of the IVSC logo. Express permission to use the logo must be sought by the interested party.
11. IVSC will provide the interested party a copy of the relevant IVSC publication in either a Microsoft Word or Adobe PDF format for reproduction, or translation and reproduction.

Licensing Fees and Royalty Payments

12. An interested party that wishes to reproduce, or translate and reproduce, an IVSC publication may be charged a licensing fee and royalty payment. The amount of the licensing fee and the royalties will be determined on a case by case basis, based on for example, the nature and size of the interested party, the intended use, particularly whether the publication is for commercial purposes, and the audience.

Exposure Drafts or Consultation Papers

13. The intention of exposure drafts and consultation papers is to achieve wide dissemination and feedback. Interested parties are allowed to reproduce exposure drafts and consultation papers for the sole purpose of preparing comments to be submitted to the IVSC, provided that such copies are for personal or intraorganisational use only and are not sold or disseminated and provided each copy acknowledges IVSC copyright and sets out the IVSC address in full.

IVSC publications freely available on the IVSC website

14. Although a number of final publications issued by IVSC are made freely available on the IVSC website, this does not mean that such publications are in the public domain. IVSC permission must be requested for any distribution or dissemination of this material. This may include reproduction of IVSC copyrighted material, or extracts thereof, in other standards or publications, textbooks, audit manuals, software applications, presentations, classroom or presentation handout materials. Permission should also be requested to post any IVSC copyrighted material on websites or to provide links to IVSC's website.



APPENDIX A

Information to be Included in a Request for Permission to Reproduce, or Translate and Reproduce, Copyrighted Final IVSC Publications

An interested party's Permission Request shall be in English and shall include the following information, where appropriate:

- . Format (hardbound or softbound edition, loose-leaf edition, online, or CD-ROM)
- . Website address (where the publication can be downloaded)
- . General description of the content (e.g., other material that will be included in the publication)
- . Anticipated audience
- . Intended selling price and expectation of financial gain
